Participants will be judged during the afternoon and then the Fashion Revue Show and awards will be presented in the evening. Because Cloverbuds are not judged, they only need to attend the evening Fashion Revue Show. See the schedule listed above.

Classes will be as follows:

Class 1: Cloverbud Modeling for Fun (Participation only)

Class 2: Junior Modeling for Fun

Class 3: Intermediate Modeling for Fun

Class 4: Senior Modeling for Fun

Class 5: Junior Artistic Clothing Buymanship

Class 6: Intermediate Artistic Clothing Buymanship

Class 7: Senior Artistic Clothing Buymanship

Class 8: Junior Clothing Construction (STEAM 1, 2, & 3)

Class 9: Intermediate Clothing Construction (STEAM 1, 2, & 3)

Class 10: Senior Clothing Construction (STEAM 1, 2, & 3)

Class 11: Junior Artistic Clothing DYD & Creative Sewing, Heritage Arts and Leathercraft

Class 12: Intermediate Artistic Clothing DYD & Creative Sewing, Heritage Arts and Leathercraft

Class 13: Senior Artistic Clothing DYD & Creative Sewing, Heritage Arts and Leathercraft

*In all classes, including 11-13, members may only model *wearable garments* that they have altered or made, not accessories. For example, if a member makes a leather jacket in the leathercraft project, that could be modeled, but just a belt or purse made in the leathercraft project cannot enter this division. Accessories must be entered in the modeling for fun category. This follows the Colorado State 4-H rule.

Awards

1. All exhibits will be judged using the Danish System. For the Danish System, all exhibits are divided in each class into blue, red, white and participation ribbon groups according to quality.

Standards for Ribbons

Blue: Meets requirements, high quality Red: Meets requirements, average quality

White: Exhibit does not meet all requirements, exhibit is below standard quality, improvement

needed

Participation: Cloverbuds (non-competitive), disqualified exhibits, or exhibition only

Within a class, the judge will compare the blue ribbon quality projects to select a champion and reserve champion ribbon.

Champions in each *senior* class (7, 10, & 13) will advance on to State Fair with the exception of modeling for fun. (Modeling for Fun cannot advance on to the State Fair.) Reserve Champions will be alternates.

Fashion Revue Contest

From all of the champions in each class (within an age division – junior, intermediate, senior), Overall Grand Champion, Overall Reserve Grand Champion, and Overall Honorable Mention will be designated – to include classes 2-13. These are similar to judge's choice awards and do not confer eligibility to participate in State Fair.

Fashion Revue Rules (This does not include Modeling for Fun)

- 1. County youth enrolled in Clothing Construction STEAM 1, 2, & 3 (exception: Sewing for Others), Artistic Clothing Decorate Your Duds, Artistic Clothing Creative Sewing, Artistic Clothing Buymanship, Heritage Arts and Leathercraft are eligible to participate.
- 2. Contestants must model a garment, not accessories, made in clothing construction, heritage arts, leathercraft or artistic clothing or a purchased garment in the clothing buymanship project.
- 3. Garments made during the current club year in fulfillment of project requirements are eligible for competition. Participation in other (non-4-H) contests does not eliminate them from this event.
- 4. All garments modeled by participants must also be entered and judged in the appropriate exhibit day division.
- 5. Contestants may model in more than one class.

Modeling for Fun Rules

- 1. Any youth may participate in the "Modeling for Fun" contest, even if they are not enrolled in one of the projects listed above in #1.
- 2. Participants may model an outfit purchased at the store for school or a special occasion, or an outfit made for them by someone else, or accessories made in heritage arts or leathercraft.
- 3. The participants will explain in their commentary why they chose this outfit, where they plan to wear it, and how the outfit compliments their style and personality.
- 4. Youth who enter this category will be able to participate in the workshop and Fashion Revue and learn modeling techniques and confidence on stage.
- 5. The same judging guide used for clothing projects will be used for Modeling For Fun.
- 6. Contestants will be split into age divisions (Cloverbud, junior, intermediate, and senior); however senior "Modeling for Fun" contestants will not be able to qualify for the State 4-H Fashion Revue.
