4-H is for youth ages 5 to 19. Studies show that 4-Hers say they are better decision makers, problem solvers, public speakers, and team members because of life skills developed in 4-H. They also credit 4-H with helping them develop their leadership skills and a commitment to their community. 4-H community clubs are led by adult volunteers who help youth run their own club meetings, develop club activities and service projects, and explore a variety of projects. 4-H helps young people see themselves as unique, resilient, life-long learners who actively participate in their own future!

### Community Clubs

Community club members are 5 to 19 years old. Clubs are spread throughout the county, so you can find one to join near you. Club members work on projects, complete community service activities, and plan group activities.



### Projects

Members must complete at least one project per year. There are more than 50 projects to choose from including archery, dog obedience, cake decorating, cats, photography, veterinary science, foods, clothing design, rocketry, chickens, etc.



### Camps

If you want to expand your 4-H experience, there are lots of opportunities for overnight camps and conferences where we focus on building leadership skills, learning new things, making friends, and having fun!

**Enrollment Fee:** \$30 for members, \$20 for Cloverbuds (members ages 5-7)
